# **Application procedure**

#### E-mail nomination

Nominations are to be sent by e-mail to: <a href="mailto:international.welcomeservices@grenoble-inp.fr">international.welcomeservices@grenoble-inp.fr</a> Indicate the first name and surname of the student, their e-mail and the School or Field of study in which they want apply for.

#### **Deadline for nominations**

- Full academic year or Fall semester: April 15<sup>th</sup>
- Spring semester: October 31<sup>th</sup>

Note: Grenoble INP – Esisar in Advanced Systems and Networks doesn't accept students in Spring semester.

#### Supporting documents to be uploaded

(please provide a translation in English or in French)

- Curriculum Vitae Resume
- Cover letter
- Copy of last degree obtained
- List of past courses taken at Home University
- List of courses currently taken in Home University
- Academic transcript of records
- Language certificate (English and/or French)
- Recommendation letter from one of your Professor
- Learning agreement
- Letter from the Home University certifying that the student is allowed to study abroad through a mobility program.



### Language requirements

The exchange program guidelines establish that student must have sufficient knowledge of the French language. <sup>1</sup> To attest the level in French and/or English, student must provide either an official test, a certificate from a language instructor stating the CECR Level equivalence.<sup>2</sup>

#### French requirements:

For French taught program, a B1 level is recommended.

#### **English requirements:**

- For double-degree students, a B2 level will be necessary to obtain the engineering degree.
- International Masters are taught in English.
- For English-taught programs a B1 level is recommended, a B2 level is preferable.

Note: some Master's programs cannot accept exchange students, please check with the Schools.

#### Academic Calendar

#### **Academic year courses**

The academic year is divided into two semesters, the first one starts at the beginning of September until the end of January and the second one stretches from January till the end of June. The start and end dates of classes are different from one school to another and depend on the study year in which student enter the school. Please refer to the host School to know exactly when the semester is beginning and ending.

#### **Exams**

Students will register to courses at their arrival directly in Schools. Undergraduate students may take graduate courses if and only if they meet the prerequisites and it fits in their schedule. Students are encouraged to select courses of the same year level and in the same field of study to avoid any conflict of schedule.

The start and end dates of exams are different from one school to another. Please refer to the host School to know exactly when the exams are beginning and ending.
